

Book Club Game 2

Find someone who...

This is an old but effective game that works well at a Book Club meeting. It gets your students talk about themselves. You can have little chats with your students before the lesson to write specific questions for them.

Time: 10-15 minutes

Materials: sheets of paper, questions

Procedure: Write down at least one question for each student or Book Club member. Ask them to walk around in the room and ask each other their questions until they find the right person. You can cut up and use the sample questions.

Sample questions:

Find someone who...

- 1 likes to read in the bath.
- 2 reads during breakfast.
- 3 always reads before going to bed.
- 4 loves comics.
- 5 doesn't like talking about himself/herself.
- 6 can recite a poem by heart.
- 7 likes watching film adaptations of classics.
- 8 knows a tongue twister in English.
- 9 has read Shakespeare.
- 10 is a member of the local library.
- 11 enjoys science-fiction.
- 12 has never listened to an audio book.
- 13 has a dog named after a character in a book.
- 14 has never read *Winnie-the-Pooh*.
- 15 writes comments in books.
