He looked after Conrad when both his parents died.

**1874-78** Worked on French ships in Marseilles, France

1878 Joined the British Merchant Navy, where he later

became Captain

1878-94 Sailed all over the world1890 Went to Belgian Congo1894 Became a full-time writer

- His real name was Jozef Teodor Konrad Nalecz Korzeniowski.
- He read a lot of literature and learnt French at an early age.
- He had a passion for the sea and wanted to become a sailor.
- In 1886 he obtained British nationality.
- He influenced writers including T.S. Eliot, Graham Greene, Virginia Woolf, Thomas Mann, Ernest Hemingway, F. Scott Fitzgerald, and William Faulkner.
